What camp group should my child be in?

Your child will be placed in a camp group with other children their age. Their specific group will also be based on how many days per week they are attending camp.

What does separation optional mean?

Separation optional camp sections are for children who are working on separation AND children who can be dropped-off. For children who have not yet separated, our trained teaching staff will work on a separation plan to help support a confident and gradual separation process. For children who are already attending drop-off programs and who have confidently separated from their grown-ups, it is recommended that they attend camp as a drop-off program.

Can camp be my child's first separation experience? Can we separate at some point during the summer?

Yes, for families enrolled in our separation optional groups, grown-ups are welcome to gradually separate as campers become comfortable with their surroundings. Every child and family will separate at different times and our teachers are here to help facilitate the separation process.

Can I start camp in the middle of a session?

We try to be as accommodating as possible when it comes to camp. The minimum length that we recommend is 2 weeks but if we have space in a particular group, we will try our best to fit you in.
